#### Pastor's Note: October 2025

"For as in one body we have many members, and all the members do not have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ . . ."

-- Romans 12:4-5a

In the church, October is a month for remembering our connections with others. There are two events, both happening on the same day: World Communion Sunday and the "Neighbors in Need" special offering.

World Communion Sunday began in 1933, in the depths of the Great Depression. A Presbyterian minister, Rev. Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr, wanted to promote the biblical understanding of the Church as a single Body of Christ. So, he and his church began to observe the first Sunday in October a day to promote Christian unity and the acceptance of different traditions. He wanted to work to make Ephesians a reality, "One Lord, one faith, one baptism . . . " In 1940, in the shadow of World War II, the Federal Council of Churches (predecessor of the National Council of Churches) adopted the idea. The predecessor denominations of the UCC also adopted it. The denominations which have adopted it are primarily Protestant. Sadly, the Lord's Supper, which was intended to symbolize all Christians being "one Body", still divides the Body of Christ into Protestant, Catholic, and Orthodox. It is thus appropriate today to remember our unity in Christ with fellow Christians around the world.

"Neighbors in Need" (NIN) is a special offering in the UCC to support a variety of ministries in the United States. Until the re-organization of our national body, this offering was used to support the mission activities of "The Board of Homeland Missions". It now funds missions ranging from local justice projects to Native American ministries. About 33 % of this offering goes to the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM), which advocates for Native American congregations and concerns in the UCC. The rest of this special offering goes to support a variety of special ministries and justice projects, including providing grants to local congregations who have come up with special projects to serve their communities and need funding to get started.

So, as Paul writes, "so we, though many, are one body in Christ', take time this month to remember our connections with other Christians – including those with whom we disagree! – and recommit our selves to be witnesses, in word and action, to our unity in Christ.

#### St. Paul's Church Council Minutes - September 21, 2025

- 1. Mike called meeting to order 10:45. Mike gave the prayer.
- 2. Dave Rieder Reported the church is 90% painted. We have some foundation work that needs attention in the future. We also have some rotting molding that needs attention. Inside this winter, the halls and rooms will be painted; some staining is also in order. Steeple is all redone with metal facia to keep squirrels away. We have 7 trees that need removing. Hal has a lift that we will use for a cost of between \$500-2,000. We can get all that done in one day. We will replant new trees. We got \$40,000 from insurance because of storm damage that we applied to the repairs of the steeple and roof replacement. For the cemetery we need a new sign that Judy requested for the near future. We need new carpet in the future too. For now we will clean it. Jim asked that the new sign be put up.
  - 3. Approval of minutes of Aug. 17. Motion Meg, Jim second. Passed.
- 4. Jim gave a summary of our finances. Green Wealth Investment is doing very well. We are still down \$12,528 for our net operating income. We will ask people to consider increasing their giving. Motion by Meg to approve Jim's report, second by Mike. Passed.
- 5. Pastor's Report Schedule Pastor needs a week off in Oct. We must decide who will do that service on Sunday, Oct. 26. We agree that Lani will organize our people to cover the church service that Sunday. He did 2 funerals (Shawne Worley and Steve McCurry), 2 visits (John and Mary). He is traveling to Georgia to meet with other clergy members for a camping trip from Oct. 24 -27.
- 6. Old Business: With our experimenting with locations, the sound system position near the altar seems successful. We will try taking the top section off the stack to see if the pastor's echo diminishes when he speaks into the microphone.
- 7. New Business: Neighbors in Need We can apply for grants of money through this UCC avenue. We will take up a special offering to support this fund. We can give money to them as part of our mission funding.
- 8. Singapore Cultural Dinner Oct. 11 or 18. We chose October 18. Lani will notify our family from Singapore.
- 9. Year- end Mission Proposals Jim said we gave \$7,337.00 to our missions in 2024. We could contribute to the Monticello Diversity Group to help local immigrants. Jim recommended we help the Bonde family of Buffalo whose son lost his home to fire recently. Lani shared a proposal for Shawne's younger brother Kevin who lost his legs and fingers from flesh-eating bacteria to cover one of his outstanding medical bills (\$2,500). Proposal for books for Minnesota Excellence in Learning Academy (MELA) school Pre-K-6 grades. We gave \$500 to Team Africa for their little bags which we will recoup the money as we sell them for \$5.00. We listed all possible donation sites.

At our annual meeting we set percentage amounts for the categories for contributions of our mission funds.

20% UCC Programs for total of \$1200. (We also have \$1,400 from previous budget.)

30% local

25% World

25% Metro

Motion to contribute to all groups listed except Delano Senior Center in the amount shown below by Meg, second by Mike. Passed.

#### **TABLES USED FOR DINING**

The options for preparing tables for dining prior to fellowship or other dining events are: 1). Wash tabletops with antibacterial solution or a soap/water spray in sufficient time for the table to dry before dining. A Dawn/water solution is contained in a spray bottle is located on the counter under the south window is in the kitchen for this purpose OR 2).
